GO READ THESE SCRIPTURES:

When Jesus hit the public stage He went around announcing the Euangelion of God's kingdom

- **Read Matthew 4:17 & Matthew 4:23**

One of Jesus' biggest demonstrations of The Gospel is when He was crucified on the Cross and died for all of our sins, Jesus was made fun of and treated disrespectfully, people shouted mean evil things to Him as He went to die on the Cross for all of humanity.

The victory of The Gospel then came 3 days later when Jesus was resurrected from the dead!!

- **Read Matthew 28:1-8**

REFLECTION QUESTIONS:

1. *What stood out to you the most from the video and reading? Why did it stand out to you?*
2. *Is there anything that is confusing to you about the gospel?*
3. *What are some things that Jesus does that is different than how the world does it? (patient, sacrificial, thinks about others, etc.)*
4. *Why do you think it was (and still is) important to live differently than the rest of the world? If we tell people the gospel, but do not live out that gospel do you think that affects how people could receive it?*
5. *One of the things in Jesus' upside-down kingdom calls us to love our enemies. Also to serve others..How do you think that you can live that out in day to day life?*

6. Have you ever shared the gospel with someone? If so, share about when that was and what happened.
7. Take some time and try sharing the gospel with each other as if they did not know Jesus yet.
 - a. Example: The gospel is the story of God coming and rescuing humanity so that we could have a relationship with Him. In the beginning there was a time that humanity lived in perfect relationship with God. However, sin (being off the mark of God) entered the world and it created a separation between us and God, because we were now imperfect and He is still perfect. BUT God set a plan in motion. He sent his one and only son down to become a man, but also fully God at the same time. He lived a perfect life with no sin, and eventually died on the cross and rose three days later. This was all a sacrifice that paid the price for humanity's sins. It now allows us to come into relationship with Him. If you want a relationship with Him, He asks that you repent (turn from your old ways into new ways), believe in Him, and follow Him with your whole life. Is that something you are interested in?

PRAYER:

Dear God,

Thank You for sending us Your One and Only Son Jesus to die on the cross and take away our sin, so we can have a relationship with You. This is an amazing gift that we can not receive by our own strength so thank You. Please forgive us for the times that we sin against You. Help us know you, learn your teachings, and live like you. Jesus, this week please give us opportunities to live like You, and give us the courage to do something! We love You.
